SODZ Holiday Party 2004

The SODZ Holiday party will once again be at Rick & Gayle DeShone's residence. We have been seeing a lot of old friends this year along with many new faces, so we look forward to a well-attended event. Many distinct and unusual "finds" show up at these parties. You are almost guaranteed to encounter a beer you have never tried before.

The party is a social event. **Spouses, significant others, and children are welcome.** We have children aged 11 & 13 who will help keep the younger set occupied. As in the past this is a casual event that involves a buffet style dinner, any commercial or home-brewed beer members want to bring, a beer exchange, and lots of conversation and good cheer.

The DeShones will procure main entrées (probably a poultry dish and ever-popular bratwurst). We ask that everyone **bring a side-dish or dessert**. If you are bringing a keg(s), we will set up an area where it can be sampled by all. We will have the usual 5 kegs on tap in the bar.

We will be doing a beer exchange. **Bring a gift-wrapped bottle for the exchange.** Everyone who does gets a number and will come away with one bottle from the exchange. (With this crowd it is best to bring something unusual or not easily found. If you bring a macro-brewed American Lager you may also want to consider armor.)

The DeShone house is in the Bristol Commons sub-division in Dublin. The entrance is 1 block East on Brand from the intersection of Brand and Muirfield. Bristol is the main drive into the subdivision, and the DeShones are the first house on the right. Assuming all outdoor electrical is working, look for the SODZ logo projected on the side of the house.

As we did last year, we have the starting time set for 7:00 PM. If you are dealing with conflicting schedules, there will be people around until midnight if you need to stop in later. **Please RSVP to** <u>rdeshone@columbus.rr.com</u> to let us know the number in your party and give us a hint of your side-dish or dessert so that we can do some planning on our buffet layout. SODZ 2nd Annual British Beerfest Competition

aka: The Irwin Memorial (yes, he's doing fine)

Location: Leatherlips Yacht Club 9230 Shawnee Trail Powell, OH 43065

10 A.M. Saturday, April 9, 2005

Scope: The scope of this competition is limited to the traditional British BJCP styles including Mead and Cider.

Eligibility: The competition is open to all non-commercial, home-produced beers and meads. Enter as many categories and as often as you wish. Competition organizers, sponsors, judges, and stewards may enter the competition but may not judge or steward any category that they are entered in.

Categories: The SODZ British Beerfest will accept entries from the following categories as defined by the 2004 BJCP Style Guidelines:

8.	English Pale Ale (all subcategories)			
9.	9. Scottish and Irish Ales (all subcategories)			
11.	I. English Brown Ale (all subcategories)			
12.	12. Porter (all subcategories)			
13.	13. Stout (all subcategories except 13E. American Stout)			
14.India Pale Ale (14A English IPA only)19.Strong Ale (19A. Old Ale and 19B. English Barley Wine only)				
24.	I. Traditional Mead			
25.	5. Melomel (Fruit Mead)			
26.	Other Mead			
27.	Standard Cider and Perry (all subcategories except 27C. French)			
28.	28. Specialty Cider and Perry (all subcategories except 28A. New England))			

All entries must indicate both a category number and a sub-category letter in addition to a written description of the style. All entries will be judged according to the appropriate sub-category style guidelines. However, categories may be combined with related categories for the purpose of awarding prizes. Multiple entries per style are allowed.

Entry Fees: \$6 for first entry, \$4 per additional entry.

Registration: All entries must be pre-registered by Friday, March 25, 2005. Pre-register online at <u>www.sodz.org</u>. Please print out the completed entry sheet, fold so your name appears on the front, and attach it to the beer bottles with a rubber band. Include entry fee (fold within label if you like). Flights will be fixed prior to event, so no late entries will be accepted. Two bottles per entry are required; bottles from 10 to 24 oz. may be used (judges will be served beer in the pitcher). Promash competition forms will also be accepted.

Mailing Instructions: Entries are due between the dates of 3/21/05 - 4/1/05, unless they are pre-registered and hand carried by a judge and/or a steward. Please ship entries to:

Call for Judges and Stewards: Judges/Stewards are invited and encouraged (OK begged) to join us. The competition is BJCP-sanctioned, and BJCP points will be awarded. If you are interested, please sign up at <u>www.sodz.org</u>.

Awards: Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place for each category (to be determined based on the numbers of entries in each style, etc.). In addition, there will individual awards given to the "Best British Beer" (BOS). Meads and Ciders will be not be eligible for "Best British Beer", however a separate award will be designated for the best Mead and/or Cider. "Best British Beer" will be awarded a traditional English "Yard Glass." Flight winners will win a smaller "yard-style glass," and second and third place will be awarded ribbons.

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END OF A BREW

Every Labor Day my family goes to Gatlinburg, TN for a family weekend. Usually 10 or twelve people for visiting, shopping, pool, golf, and — beer. This year I took some of my homebrews to share with everyone. (I was asked to bring them.) I've been fortunate to have brewed a couple of beers that other people seem to like (so far). Thank the brewing gods.

The beers were well received by everyone, but something I had not thought about happened, which inevitably happens to all brewers at least once. After sharing with everyone, we came to the <u>last bottle of the first beer I ever brewed</u>, a nut brown ale. Everyone insisted I drink it, since it was the last one. It shook me. I wasn't prepared for this. The last one! It was a good beer, that first one. It was very special to me, partly because it was the first, of course, partly because it came out so well, and partly because it was brewed from a recipe I formulated myself. Beginner's luck, to be sure, but to the uninformed, it was skill and I'm not telling.

I sat and held it, stared at it, full of excitement, and felt a certain sadness. It was like holding your last Christmas present, knowing that, as long as you haven't opened it, the anticipation is still there, the excitement of the moment is still there, but once you open it, it's over. I thought about this for a minute, and then someone in the room said, "Go ahead and drink it. It isn't like you can't brew another one." The statement was like a slap to the head. I smiled, opened the bottle, phffft, savored the pour, watched it tumble into the glass. It was a warming thing for me. As I looked at the glass, watching the head settle, I thought about whether what I was doing was the right thing, the fear that I would do/had done something wrong, plowing ahead anyway, hoping it would develop into something I could loosely call beer. I was dizzy with all the advise I had been given by everyone who kept after me to just "Do it!" They were right on with their comments, suggestions, and encouragement. In a lot of ways, that first beer was as much theirs as it was mine. My thanks to all for prodding (shaming) me into my first effort.

During my first year with SODZ, I have heard plenty of stories already about dropped carboys, brews that didn't turn out right, incredible brews that might be gold medal material, club brews, team brews, new gadgets, friendships that have evolved, the excitement of finding a new brewing ingredient, gaining new knowledge, and on and on. It is the desire to look ahead, to plan for the next great brew, to find the next great recipe, to create something you can claim as your own, and share it with friends that makes brewing so much fun. It's the joy every brewer feels when they hold a home brew in their glass, with that comfortable knowledge that **they** created it, and it is good.

It's funny how you can get lost in a process, and not take enough time to think about the shear joy of the experience. Taking time to smell the roses, I guess. I will always remember my first beer. That day in Gatlinburg, I drank my glass of beer, and it was good. The joy, I now know, continues. After all, I can brew another one!
