This month we will take nominations for officers, and the election will occur in March. The new officers will assume their duties in April.



### Beer Camp

Beer Camp is a wonderful place for beer lovers to go to enjoy drinking many wonderful beers with other beer enthusiasts. When you get there, you are assigned different groups, which you stay in and sit with during the whole camp, (lagers, porter, bocks, wiess squad, etc.).

You start out at registration, then get an in-depth tour of the Oldenberg brewery. From there you move to the hospitality room for the opening of camp. There is plenty of free Oldenberg beer to drink, and you get introductions of the camp staff and learn the camp song. They also feed you a small dinner at this point.

Then you move on to the highlight of beer camp, one of 2 brewffetts. The brewffetts have over 300 different microbrewed and import beers on ice. You have a numbered listing of the beers, which the servers pour for you into your complimentary beer camp sampling glass. This goes on from around 8:00 to 12:30. At 12:30, believe me, you are ready to crash.

You stay in a nice room at the Drawbridge Hotel, which is part of the Oldenberg complex.

The next morning, at 8:00 sharp is breakfast. Role call is taken, and if you are not there expect a call from the camp director via cell phone. Breakfast is served; then you move into some more organized beer tasting and history of beer with several guest speakers and slide shows.

Next is lunch. By the way, the food is always excellent! After lunch is one of my favorites, the pub crawl. They take you by bus to several of the brewpubs in Cincinnati. This has always been a hoot! After the pub crawl you have a special 7-course meal with beer as an ingredient in all of the food served, including dessert. Then you move on to the second brewffett.

Sunday morning is the hair-of-the-dog brunch, with a live theater performance. No beer is served on Sunday, but by that time this is not a bad thing.

Finally is camp awards and graduation, with some nice Oldenberg gifts.

I have always had a great time. It is best to go with a few people you know; it just makes it more enjoyable. Beer Camp is not really going to teach you anything more about brewing than you already know. They don't get into brewing detail much at all as part of their agenda; however, there are usually a few different brewers from microbreweries around the country there that you can ask questions of.

The main reason to go to beer camp is to sample many different beers in a short amount of time, and to enjoy them in the company of many other beer lovers.
