Our next meeting will be Monday, **February 21**, at the **Bogey Inn** on Glick Road in Dublin. The meeting begins at **7:00 P.M.**, and our guest speaker will be **Ron Wilson of Premium Beverage**. He supplies the craft beers to the Bogey Inn, and his topic will be:

"The State of Craft Beer Distributing."

To show our support for the Bogey Inn, I hope many of you will eat dinner there. The food is good and very reasonably priced. You might want to arrive a little early (around 6:00-6:30 P.M.) to allow time to order and eat before the meeting. However, if you can't make it until 7:00 P.M., they will still gladly serve you.

We have been given the green light to bring in our homebrews, but please be discreet about it - no kegs - and conceal your beer in a bag. We will be in a private meeting room. Given the ever-increasing size of our meetings (which is a good thing!), plan to bring a few bottles of your beer for others to sample.

SODZ members have been involved in a lot of activities since the beginning of the year. Last month's meeting at Brew's Café was well attended, and we thank Wes Raynor for his inspirational and informative talk last month.

We also appreciated his generous invitation to continue the meeting at his

house afterward. Wes and Pam, his wife, provided a wonderful spread of food, and we got to sample some of his high-gravity beer. It's nice to see that Wes is brewing again!

The Hoppus Maximus Challenge at Thirsty Dog scheduled for January 22 was postponed one week due to threat of inclement weather. Congratulations to the team of Mike Heilman and Don Croucher for winning Best of Show with their Oatmeal Stout! Frank Barickman shook off the "Susan Lucci syndrome" by winning his flight with his Irish Red Ale.

The next day a number of us went to the World Tour of Beers party at the Winking Lizard. The celebration honored those who finished the 2004 tour. One patron received a special prize from the Winking Lizard for completing seven tours. We understand he's scheduled for a liver transplant in the near future.

So far, I am aware of three SODZ members who are in the 2005 tour. If you go to the Winking Lizard, please credit your beer purchases to one of our members. So far, we have Kris Huckaby (#46), Bonni Katona (#47), and Gayle DeShone (#298). If others sign up, let us know so that we can add you to the list.

On Tuesday, February 8, a dozen of us went on an extensive tour of the Anheuser Busch brewery. George Haddad and Tom were our tour guides, and they walked us around various buildings where we visited floor after floor of this massive brewery, which produces 10 million barrels of beer a year.

Everything is done on a grand scale. Mash and lauter tuns, etc., were all so enormous that we figured if we got every homebrew club in the state together to brew a batch of beer that we still couldn't afford to fill even one of their tanks with ingredients. The giant aging tanks were all neatly lined up and went on as far as the eyes could see.

We watched in amazement as multiple 20-lb. bags of gypsum were added to treat the water. AJ noted that he usually adds a quarter of a teaspoon to his brew pot! We were mesmerized by the hops room. The aroma was heavenly, and we never saw so many hops in one place. They were in pellet and whole-leaf forms—some in large plastic containers and others in huge compressed blocks.

While the brewery is mammoth in size, we encountered few employees. So much of the operation is automated that they have only about 100 staff involved in the brewing process. The other 900 employees are mostly involved with the packaging end.

Thanks to Rick DeShone for arranging the tour! Some of us went to the Winking Lizard afterward and met some other SODZ. When Bob and Brea showed up from Yellow Springs, he was surprised to find a birthday cake waiting for him!

Congratulations to Jay Wince! His Imperial Stout won a gold medal and took Best of Show honors at the 2005 Upper Mississippi Mash Out. There were 512 beers entered, and this competition is a qualifying event for the Midwest Homebrewer of the Year. In addition, Jay also has an article that appears in the current issue of *Brew Your Own* magazine.

Frank Barickman and the committee have been hard at work planning the 2nd Annual SODZ British Beerfest, which is Saturday, April 9, at the Leatherlips Yacht Club. Many of the details are falling into place, but we still need help. Go to the SODZ web site to sign up to work at the competition as a judge or steward.

There is a real need for people to solicit sponsors. We have drafted a letter and need to know who has a good working relationship with any businesses who may be a sponsor. Frank will address this issue at our upcoming meeting.

Another way to help out is to enter your beers! We have set a goal of at least 100 beers at this year's comp. It has been advertised extensively in a number of publications and internet sites/discussion boards. There's still time to brew another batch or two of beer!

Finally, this month we will nominate officers for the next year. All officer positions will change since all board members have either reached their two-year time limit in their current positions or will not re-run for office. Elections take place in March, and the new officers will begin their duties in April.

I hope to see many of you at the Bogey Inn on Monday the 21st!

Eligibility: The competition is open to all non-commercial, home-produced beers and meads. Enter as many categories and as often as you wish. Competition organizers, sponsors, judges, and stewards may enter the competition but may not judge or steward any category that they are entered in.

All entries must indicate both a category number and a sub-category letter in addition to a written description of the style. All entries will be judged according to the appropriate sub-category style guidelines. However, categories may be combined with related categories for the purpose of awarding prizes. Multiple entries per style are allowed.

Entry Fees: \$6 for first entry, \$4 per additional entry.

Registration: All entries must be pre-registered by Friday, March 25, 2005. Pre-register online at <u>www.sodz.org</u>. Please print out the completed entry sheet, fold so your name appears on the front, and attach it to the beer bottles with a rubber band. Include entry fee (fold within label if you like). Flights will be fixed prior to event, so no late entries will be accepted. Two bottles per entry are required; bottles from 10 to 24 oz. may be used (judges will be served beer in the pitcher). Promash competition forms will also be accepted.

Mailing Instructions: Entries are due between the dates of 3/21/05 - 4/1/05, unless they are pre-registered and hand carried by a judge and/or a steward. Please ship entries to:

Call for Judges and Stewards: Judges/Stewards are invited and encouraged (OK begged) to join us. The competition is BJCP-sanctioned, and BJCP points will be awarded. If you are interested, please sign up at <u>www.sodz.org</u>.

Awards: Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place for each category (to be determined based on the numbers of entries in each style, etc.). In addition, there will individual awards given to the "Best British Beer" (BOS). Meads and Ciders will be not be eligible for "Best British Beer", however a separate award will be designated for the best Mead and/or Cider. "Best British Beer" will be awarded a traditional English "Yard Glass." Flight winners will win a smaller "yard-style glass," and second and third place will be awarded ribbons.
