President's Corner

s we've finished up the regular meeting schedule for the summer I would like to briefly reflect on the past year and too look to our future. As a club we have definitely grown as brewers. While I think we all realize that from sampling at our meetings, this belief is validated on how club members have done in competition. Going through my records I've recorded 28 beers from 12 brewers winning awards, including three Best of Show winners, in the past year. I've also been pleased by how many of you have volunteered to help out in the past year. A club like ours will only survive and thrive if the members participate and not sit back. I'm always looking for ideas for what to do at meetings and other club events. Help in organizing them is always appreciated.

With regards to our future, there are a number of paths we could take. One would be to stay the course. Another possibility would be to get more involved in competitions. This could involve training to be better judges, such as with a course similar to Gordon Strong's or Jeff Seeley's. An extension to this would be to have any interested members write the BJCP exam. Another option in becoming more involved in competitions would be

to host our own competition, similarly to the other major central and southern Ohio clubs. I realize that we are involved with the State Fair competition, but since Brett and the State Fair staff do almost all of the work, I really don't see that as "our" competition. One idea I would like to pursue, assuming there is enough interest, would be to host an AHA Club Only competition. The size of these are reasonable (under 40 entries) and could be a good way to see if we want to get more involved in hosting competitions. As I found out last Saturday, all that seems to be involved in hosting one is to contact the AHA informing them of our interest. We would then get put on a waiting list for the next open slot, which might take 6 months or might take 2 years. Jeff and Gordon seemed to suggest that 6 months might be more likely. Once a spot opened up, we would be informed of the style and asked if we still wished to do it. Unfortunately we couldn't pick the style as AHA has some mechanism for deciding the styles for the upcoming year. If they tried to give us American light lagers, we could always turn it down.

I was pleased to see most of the local microbrewers at the Alt tapping a few weeks ago. If I remember correctly, six brew pubs in Columbus were represented plus one in Mansfield. Thanks for coming out and helping us celebrate gentlemen. I would like to thank Victor and Walter at Hoster's, Ben at Columbus, and Vince at Elevator for their support of the club over the years. And especially I want to thank Scott, Angelo, Brad, Lenny, and the rest of the Barley's staff for what they have done for us, in particular for hosting our meetings and for brewing another club beer.

Bockanalia Results:

While we came close, Jeremy's and Matt's Maibock just got edged out in the latest AHA Club Only competition. Their beer was the high scorer in the first round with 42.5 points and was one of six beers from four flights to go onto the Best of Bock round. None of the other 36 beers scored in the 40s. I'm not quite sure exactly how things went in the final round as Elaine Seeley wouldn't allow Gordon Strong, who's Maibock also made the final round, or me in the judging room. If I remember correctly, a Doppelbock from Cary, NC won, followed by an Eisbock from San Diego, and a Maibock. The last beer in the final round was a Doppelbock.

There were some excellent beers entered and I was able to try three of the final round beers on Saturday. I judged the Eisbock and the runner up Doppelbock in the first round and was able to try Gordon's Maibock after the judging since he happened to bring along an extra bottle. All were very nice beers. Unfortunately there were a few clinkers in the first round, though most were enjoyable beers. They just happened not to be good examples of Bocks.

The next Club Only competition is for Belgian Wit beers (Category 19B) which will take place in August. We will have to judge our entries at the picnic next month, so you should have some time, but not much, to brew one to be considered.



Just a reminder that the Afternoon with the Brewers is coming up this Sunday (the 10th) from 2 to 5 in the Underground at Barley's Ale House #1. The winning brews from last years competition, Stoutasaurus Rex, the Russian Imperial Stout brewed by Bill Hughes and Chris Ticknor and Full Moon Ale, the Barley Wine that's more like a big IPA (think Sierra Nevada Celebration on Steriods based on a sample from a month ago), brewed by Mark Irwin and Mark Katona, will be tapped at this event. Also the winners from this year's competition will be announced. Hopefully the club will has similar success to last year. In addition to Scott Francis and Angelo Signorino from Barley's, Victor Ecimovich from Hoster's, Ben Pridgeon from Columbus Brewing, Vince Falcone from Elevator, and Eric Bean from Gordon Biersch are scheduled to attend with samples of their wares. The cost of the event is \$15 which includes beer samples and appitizers.


